An Eye on Email

Due to various government compliancy mandates, construction companies may find it in their best interest to keep record of all documentation that occurs within the organization. While this certainly applies to project documentation and financial data, one area some companies may overlook is email.

InfoStreet Inc., www.infostreet.com, Tarzana, Calif., believes it has come to market with a solution—tailored for both large and small companies. The company, which creates on-demand software solutions in the area of email services and workflow management, among others, announced it will offer automatic email archiving services as an extension to its Web-based solutions.

The company says the service is non-intrusive to existing email systems and supports the latest email configurations, such as SMTP, POP, and IMAP. Ensuring data integrity, InfoStreet says all incoming email is archived, can be restored without issues, and is fully scanned for viruses prior to archiving.

The service will be available to StreetSmart subscribers immediately and will be priced at \$1 per user per month. Perhaps most appealing to construction companies is the service is delivered in the SaaS (software as a service) model—a Web-based deployment option requiring no software to install or update on the part of the end-user.
